## ***Enigmas For You to Consider***

Enigmas are puzzling mysteries, numerous times throughout the past 16 years of emails and now Facebook I have received lists containing enigmas. Let's look at some of them and some accompanying Scriptures.

1. **Why is it easy to see others' mistakes, but hard to see our own?** — Matthew 7:1-6; Romans 2:1, 17-23; Luke 22:31-34
2. **Why is it easy to solve others' problems, but hard to solve our own?** — Galatians 6:4; Philippians 2:12
3. **Why is it easy to "find the time" to attend ball games, parties, and other recreational activities, but hard to attend Bible studies, worship services, and gospel meetings?** — Matthew 6:33, 21; Colossians 3:2
4. **Why is it easy to spend several hours reading the newspaper, magazines, books, sports magazines, but hard to spend just a few minutes reading the Bible?** — 1 Timothy 4:13-16
5. **Why do Christians dress up for weddings and funerals, but dress own for worshipping God?** — 1 Samuel 16:7; 1 Timothy 2:9-10; cf. James 2:1-5 (note, we should not judge others on their attire when worshipping God)
6. **Why is it easy to encourage our children to do their homework for school and excel, but hard to motivate them to do their Bible lessons?** — Ephesians 6:4
7. **Why is it easy to spend \$30-40 going out to eat or to the movies, but hard to place the same amount in the collection plate to support the work of the church?** — 1 Corinthians 16:1-2; 2 Corinthians 9:6-7; Philippians 4:14-19; 1:7
8. **Why does it seem like a sacrifice to spend an hour worshipping the lord, but easy to spend an hour watching TV?** — John 4:23-24; Psalm 147:11; 122:1
9. **Why is it easier to talk to your friends about your views on world affairs, but hard to speak about your faith in Christ?** — 1 Peter 2:9; Jeremiah 20:9
10. **How is it that we can chat with friends for hours, but find it a chore to talk to God in prayer for a few minutes each day?** — Matthew 10:37; Proverbs 15:8; Psalm 63:1-8
