Do you have any family members, friends or co-workers you can invite to attend the meeting? There is plenty of work for all of us

to become engaged in, and the great thing is with all of us working together, the potential for success in converting souls to the Lord is even that much higher! "Now this I say, he who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully," 2 Cor. 9:6. Sometimes we need some help and motivation to see how much our own individual personal involvement is needed in this work. Will you consider a few motivational thoughts to inspire and encourage you to see how much your time and effort truly makes a difference?

becomes of the thought of any of his brothers ending up in torment as he did. "And he said, 'Then I beg you, father, that you send him to my father's house for I have five brothers – in order that he may warn them, so that they will not also come to this place of torment, '" Lk. 16:27-28. I can't imagine how painfully terrified it must be for those who have died and awoken in torment to know they have living close relatives who are on the way there and there is nothing they can do to warn them. The deceased mothers, fathers, grandparents, brothers and sisters of those alive today who are suffering in agony in the eternal flame would beg, plead, and shout for us to go warn their loved ones not to follow them there. The parable of Luke reveals to us that in many ways the deceased lost souls in agony perhaps have the greatest zeal for personal evangelism and yet there is nothing they can do to spread the word. Isn't the least we can do is attempt to reach those alive


today whose lost suffering relatives in torment cannot?

Perhaps any thought of speaking one on one to a complete stranger about the gospel is a bit daunting and intimidating. That's understandable as it takes time to step out of our comfort zones and develop the courage and confidence to involve ourselves more directly in personal evangelism. All the more reason to spend time around those who do, as you can lend your much needed moral support by helping out at the booth at the fair or praying for opportunities for open doors to be available for those who are looking to invite others to the meeting. Moses had a great job to do in holding up the staff of God to allow Israel to defeat the Amalekites. But he couldn't do it alone. Others may not have been able to hold up the staff, but they could hold up Moses' hands! "But Moses' hands were heavy. Then they took a stone and put it under him. and he sat on it; and Aaron and Hur supported his

hands, one on one side and one on the other," Ex. 17:12.

There is great work to be done and two perfect opportunities this month to get involved. Let's work together for the glory of our Lord who died to save us and all the lost from their sins.

It is amazing how easy it is for us to talk about all of the negative things in this world when there is so much good we have to be thankful for! Christianity is something that should be so contagious others who see us living in the light of Christ can't help but want it too. But why would they if we seem to be just as unhappy and unfulfilled as anyone else? I realize you can't possibly ignore all of the unfortunate, sad and disheartening aspects of life. But the joy a Christian has is able to rise above and center their hearts on a life of thankfulness and praise to God. So here's the challenge: No negative talk for a month! 2) USING YOUR BIBLE IN THE WORLD

Share the following verses with someone who does not attend this congregation at least twice this month:

Philippians 4:4-14

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice! Let your gentle spirit be known to all men. The Lord is near. Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brethren, whatever is true, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is of good repute, if there is any excellence and if anything worthy of praise, dwell on these things. The things you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you. But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly, that now at last you have revived your concern for me; indeed, you were concerned before, but you lacked opportunity. Not that I speak from want, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I am. I know how to get along with humble means, and I also know how to live in prosperity; in any and every circumstance I have learned the secret of being filled and going hungry, both of having abundance and suffering need. I can do all things through Him who strengthens me. Nevertheless, you have done well to share with me in my affliction."
