

For the past 30 years, Davis, a black man, has spent time befriending members of the Ku Klux Klan. He says once a friendship is formed, the Klansmen begin to believe that their hate was misguided. Since Davis started talking with these members, he says 200 Klansmen have given up their robes. Whenever that would happen, Davis would add the robe to his collection which he keeps as a reminder of the dent he's made in racism simply by sitting down and having dinner with people. Davis would begin by having a conversation about their organization, earning their respect by showing how knowledgeable he was about them. According to Davis, "That began to chip away at their ideology because when two enemies are talking, they're not fighting. It's when the talking ceases that the ground becomes fertile for violence. If you spend five minutes with your worst enemy -- it doesn't have to be about race, it could be about anything...you will find that you both have something in

common. As you build upon those commonalities, you're forming a relationship and as you build about that relationship. you're forming a friendship. That's what would happen. I didn't convert anybody. They saw the light and converted themselves." What an amazing lesson can be learned from this man as we seek success in bringing the lost to Christ. How many opportunities could we gain to help educate and encourage others who are opposed to Christianity simply be befriending them and engaging in humble conversation. Jesus was able to teach a selfrighteous Pharisee the needed principles of compassionate love for sinners simply by sharing a meal with him. "Now one of the Pharisees was requesting Him to dine with him, and He entered the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. And there was a woman in the city who was a sinner; and when she learned that He was reclining at the table in the Pharisee's house, she brought an alabaster vial of perfume, and standing behind Him at His feet, weeping, she began to wet His feet with her tears, and kept wiping them with the hair of her head, and kissing His feet and anointing them with the perfume. Now when the Pharisee who had invited Him saw this, he said to himself, 'If

this man were a prophet He would know who and what sort of person this woman is who is touching Him, that she is a sinner.' And Jesus answered him, 'Simon, I have something to say to you.' And he replied, 'Say it, Teacher.' 'A moneylender had two debtors; one owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. When they were unable to repay, he graciously forgave them both. So which of them will love him more?' Simon answered and said, 'I suppose the one whom he forgave more.' And He said to him, 'You have judged correctly.' Turning toward the woman. He said to Simon, 'Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has wet My feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair.
