

When Paul was dealing with the chaotic worship services going on in Corinth, he emphasizes the importance of understanding what is being said so that those engaged in the worship can be in agreement to say "Amen." "I will pray with the spirit and I

will pray with the mind also; I will sing with the spirit and I will sing with the mind also. Otherwise if you bless in the spirit only, how will the one who fills the place of the ungifted say the "Amen" at your giving of thanks, since he does not know what you are saying?" 1 Cor. 14:15-16. This is why he is emphasizing how important it is that everyone is able to understand completely what is being said in worship, since it is expected that a verbal "Amen" is said in response. "Then Ezra blessed the LORD the great God.
